



Special Travel Notice for Honduras

In accordance with MS 220, 3.3.2, the Offices of Safety and Security and Global Operations restrict Volunteer travel to Honduras until further notice.

Volunteer transit travel through Tegucigalpa's International Airport (Toncontín) and San Pedro Sula's International Airport (Ramon Villeda Morales) is permitted, so long as the transit does not require an overnight stay and the Volunteer does not leave the airport. Volunteer travel by air to the Bay Islands is allowable.

The Department of State continues to warn U.S. citizens that the level of crime and violence in Honduras remains critically high, although it has declined in the past two years... Crime and violence are serious problems throughout the country. The Government of Honduras lacks sufficient resources to properly respond to, investigate, and prosecute cases. As a result, criminals operate with a high degree of impunity throughout Honduras. Since 2010, Honduras has had one of the highest murder rates in the world, and the U.S. Embassy has recorded 42 murders of U.S. citizens during the same time period, with 10 recorded since January 2014.
